


## **GOD'S LOVE IN THE MIDST OF MAN'S DEPRAVITY**

After Dad was released from communist hard-labor prisons and was reunited with his family in Sweden he was eager to expose the atrocities of communism and hoped that one day he would be able to share his testimony with the world. Dad's autobiography has touched millions with the powerful truth that God's love always reaches us in our darkest hour of need.

While it was a crushing blow to Dad when the communists forcefully removed him from his pulpit, something good did come out of it. He quickly realized that his pulpit could in fact be wherever he was. He spent the rest of his internment witnessing and ministering to his fellow prisoners, using every opportunity to serve as a prison pastor. As a result, Dad made a difference in the life of every inmate he ever met.

With your help, I want to complete the 28th language translation of Tortured for His Faith (TFHF) in the Ukrainian language! As I write this letter, there is an urgent need for Father's story to be distributed amongst the Ukrainian refugees and those remaining in war-ravaged Ukraine. I believe that TFHF will not only strengthen the Ukrainian people's faith during these dark days, but will also inspire them to make a difference in the life of their fellow man wherever they are for the glory of God.



## WHO IS MY 'NEIGHBOR'?

Proverbs 3:28 shows us that our 'neighbor' is someone who asks for our help. We also see that the Scripture stresses to not delay to help when you are able, but to do it quickly, immediately.

When Pastor Misha, in Lviv, with whom we have worked with for more than 30 years, pleaded for help, we immediately responded. He is an example of a good neighbor making a difference supporting hundreds of Christian refugees and internally displaced Ukrainians.

He writes: "...thanks for your love and support. You have helped us in our difficult time, and now with your help we are helping our 'neighbors': displaced Roma people, inmates in prison, and those who find themselves in need having fled their looted and bombed cities..."

I am so impressed and proud of our field workers who are at great risk to their own lives as they rescue people and bring humanitarian aid to the hardest-hit areas of Ukraine, such as Mariupol, Kharkiv, Mykolaev and other cities that have experienced the worst of the Russian onslaught.

Due to Putin's new war offensive in Eastern Ukraine we need to help evacuate as many people as possible. More vehicles are desperately needed to bring people to safer areas. These vehicles will also be used to bring much needed food, medicine and other life-sustaining supplies.
